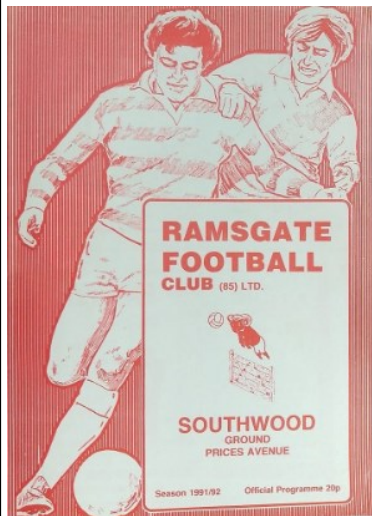


proud **past:1991/92**



During his 2nd close season as manager, Bob Wickens strengthened his squad ready for the 1991/92 campaign.

He signed former Hastings 'keeper Steve Kemble, midfielders Darren Wilkins from Canterbury City and Danny Kimber who had played for Herne Bay and Margate, defender Cliff Stokes from Whitstable.

Mark Smelt joined to assist with coaching and Kevin Hughes took over the Under 18s (with Paul Jefcoate player manager for the Reserves).

In September striker Peter Kemp, who had previously played for Maidstone Utd, Sutton and Dover, signed for the Rams.

In November Paul Lamb re-signed after brief spells at Dartford and Margate, with John Munday joining his brother Mark at Herne Bay, while at the end of the season, Gary Kerr returned for the last few games.

The Rams' Kent League campaign saw them win 16 and draw 7 out of 40 matches, giving them 55 points and 10th place in the league, the same final position as the previous season.

To achieve this they did the double over Danson Furness United, Darenth Heathside, Thamesmead Town and Tunbridge Wells.

They also had home wins over Beckenham, Deal Town, Greenwich Borough, Thames Poly, with away victories over Chatham Town, Cray Wanderers, Kent Police and Tonbridge.

The League Cup started with a 2nd Round win over Darenth Heathside at home, 3-2 after extra time, but in the quarter final that followed Faversham Town were the victors by the only goal, again after extra time.

No FA competition entries this season, while in the Kent Senior Trophy Ramsgate lost to Herne Bay 2-1, the Rams' goal coming from John Munday (shortly before his move to Winch's Field – un-related?)

On 9 December 1991 there was a friendly at Southwood against a QPR XI, in response to the First Division club (the equivalent of the Premiership, for younger readers) signing Ben Pratt from Ramsgate's associated youth club, Westgate Sports. Ben had also played for the Rams' U18s and Reserves.

An early own goal didn't help the Rams' cause, but Gary Hammond's spectacular 30 yard shot brought the Rams level at the interval. QPR regained the lead on the hour mark but Gary Hammond added his second after Paul Hill's strike had been disallowed. QPR finished strongly to add two further goals in the closing minutes of what had been a most entertaining game that ended up 2-4 (and which would have been 3-4 if Paul Hill's goal had stood - oh well).
